Child and Youth Mental Health Treatment Act (CYMTHA)

This act allows families to access mental health treatment services for their child or youth. This is an alternative to child welfare involvement when a dependency and neglect action isn't warranted.

Eligibility:

- Must have a mental health diagnosis
- Must be at risk of out of home placement
- Isn't eligible for Medicaid
- Accesses the program prior to their 18th birthday
- Doesn't have a pending or current dependency and neglect action with child welfare.

Things to Consider:

- Parents or the legal guardian are responsible for 7% of the total costs of treatment provided under the act and must pay a minimum of \$50 per calendar month.
- If a child or youth is placed in residential care under this funding, the parent or legal guardian must apply for SSI for the child or youth within 10 business days.
