For students who are homeless, in transition, or lack fixed housing

- Children and youth that lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence are considered homeless. This can mean families who share housing with other persons (doubled-up), living in motels, hotels, inadequate trailer parks, shelters, unaccompanied youth, migratory children, and/or living in cars or public spaces.
- The following educational accommodations or supports are made for homeless youth:
 - Immediate enrollment without proof of residency, immunizations, school records, or other documents;
 - Transportation to the school of origin;
 - Enrollment in free lunch program and other school resources;
 - Identify and remove barriers that prevent youth from receiving appropriate credit for coursework
 - Assistance from counselors to advise and improve readiness for college;
 - Privacy protections under FERPA about student's living situation;
 - Providing school stability;
 - Keeping the student in the school of origin or enrolling in any public school that is within the attendance area where the student is residing.

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SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES

- Oversees and manages special education services in Jefferson County School District.

Child Find: 303-982-7247

- Provides free developmental assessments for young children from birth to 5 years of age. Can help families determine if their child is eligible for special education services in the areas of learning, speech, language, motor skills and social/emotional needs. This is a free resource to Jefferson County residents.

Fletcher Miller School: 303-982-7200

- Provides services to students with individual needs in the areas of medical, physical, social/emotional, and communication supports in order to successfully transition each student in special education to his/her least restrictive environment. Serves PK-12th grade.

Sobesky Academy: 303-982-5995

- Provides an alternative to out-of-district placement, and is designed to meet the intensive emotional, behavioral, and related academic needs of students with identified emotional disabilities.

Rocky Mountain Deaf School: 720-961-9200 (Video Phone), 303-984-5749 (Voice)

- Provides Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing children, PK-8th grade, a publicly funded bilingual education that promotes academic excellence, full proficiency in ASL and English literacy, and supports the home/school connection by offering a "Deaf friendly" environment.

- Optional program for young adults with special needs who are 18-21 years of age and who have completed their high school education. Eligible students are those who demonstrate a need for significant support and training in one or more of the following areas: Career And Employment, Education and Training, and/or Adult Independent Living.

- Classes may include: Manufacturing, drafting, Alternative Cooperative Education (ACE), business, family and consumer sciences, visual and design arts, health sciences, marketing, auto, engineering, and work study.
- Classes may be offered at neighborhood middle and high schools or Warren Technical School – North and Central Campuses.

ONLINE EDUCATION

- Offers online education courses for students, grades 6-12. Students can elect to study full time and receive a high school diploma, go part time and continue classes at home or at another school, or take credit recovery classes to obtain additional credits. Classes are **tuition-free** for all Colorado students grades 6-12. (Tuition-based courses are available for adult learners)

GRADUATION CREDIT RECOVERY

- Jefferson County Public Schools has a variety of options for students who are in need of recovering graduation credit. Contact your student's school for options.

Offers online courses, grades 9 – 12, designed to meet graduation requirements. The fee for students enrolled in a Jeffco School is \$20.00 per family.

- Provides services to re-engage students who are at-risk of dropping out or who have dropped out of school.

OPTIONS FOR STUDENTS EXPELLED, TRUANT, OR IN THE COURT SYSTEM

- **Truancy Office:** 303-982-6692
Works with schools, and the parents of students who have attendance problems through personal contacts and conferences.
- **Students in the Court System:** 720-497-7788
Provides a Judicial Specialist that works with at-risk students involved in the juvenile justice system, on probation or paroling back into the community.
- **Connections Learning Center:** 303-982-7004
Offers an educational experience for students, grades 7-9, who have been expelled from Jeffco Public Schools or who are "at risk" for expulsion.
- **Mount View Youth Services Center:** 303-987-4525
Jeffco Public Schools works in partnership with the Division of Youth Corrections to provide education services onsite to youth in residential placement. Offers classes in social studies, math, language arts, science, elective classes, and recreation, allowing youth to work toward a high school diploma or GED.
